In 2021, we took in-person shut downs as a chance to pause and reinvest in our community. From the beginning, we've been an organization devoted to reclaiming the Vietnamese narrative and giving a platform for emerging artists of color. To that end, we launched the inaugural Việt Writers Lab with six playwrights of the Vietnamese diaspora from across North America and helped them develop their works through a holistic program. Beginning with a generative process drawn from the story circle tradition as practiced by Free Southern Theatre and Junebug Productions, we moved into masterclasses and panel discussions with professionals in the field, and then a more traditional writing group format.

We've continued that process with our second Việt Writers Lab. We have had the immense pleasure of working with three talented playwrights based in the Northeast region of the United States. Through a hybrid model of digital meetings and rehearsals, we conclude our week of in-person work with presentations of their new plays.




Tuânminh Albert Đỗ (Playwright)




Katelyn Trieu (LIÊN 1)

In a hospital room in Cement, Oklahoma, a boy robs a pawn shop and hides under the bed of a comatose man. When it turns out the man is his girlfriend's dad, and he has come to ask for his blessing to marry his daughter, a neo-Shakespearean tragedy ensues.

Love by the Hour

Bi and Thuy meet multiple times throughout their lives, seeking refuge in each other, and within the walls of a rent-by-the-hour love hotel in Saigon, Vietnam. Tracking their relationship from 2010 — 2067, this non-chronologically ordered play tracks the identity of a couple and a country as they endure significant changes.

Boy in Front of Burning Building

Two fraternal twins meet at their dead dad's art opening to claim rights to his masterpiece "Boy in Front of Burning Building." When the identity of the faceless boy in the photo becomes subject to question, all chaos ensues. Boy in Front of Burning Building is a dark, farcical dramedy about art, ownership, and the secrets that tear a family apart.
